Let There Be Light— But Not Rain, Snow or Sleet

When our Lakewood Masonic Temple was constructed in 1916, electric lighting was still a relatively recent technology. The interior spaces were apparently not lighted to the same level of brightness that we are accustomed to today. So it seems logical that one major function of the many windows in the Temple was to admit light, at least during the day. Another important function, of course, was ventilation.

But nearly 90 years later, many of our windows have deteriorated to the point that they also admit rain, snow or sleet, especially during storms with high winds. The water that leaks in around deteriorated window frames is causing serious damage to interior plaster and painted decorations, as can be clearly seen in the accompanying photograph. In fact, the National Park Service's Technical Preservation Division advises that "windows are among the most vulnerable features of historic buildings undergoing rehabilitation."

It is absolutely essential that the worst of our windows be rehabilitated as quickly as possible to prevent additional interior damage. The pivot windows on the Lodge Room balcony level and the triple-hung, multi-divided light windows on the Ballroom level, are the two types with the most pressing needs for rehabilitation. Further study will reveal whether additional glazing can be added to these windows during restoration to upgrade their thermal insulation value and thereby save heating



costs during our cold weather months.

What About that Life Insurance Stock?

Did your life insurance company surprise you with some shares of stock in recent years? If so, you're not alone. Many mutual life insurance companies changed their form of organization, and, in the process, issued shares of stock to policyholders. In some cases, if a policy face value was relatively modest, only a few shares were received and seemed to some mostly an annoyance.

An interesting tax question has arisen from the issuance of these shares. The question is—what, if anything, is your cost basis in these shares? The IRS and various tax practitioners do not universally agree on the answer. One argument is that since you didn't pay anything directly for these shares, your cost basis is zero. The opposing argument is the shares obviously had some value at the time they were issued to you, so that value must be your cost basis. The latter position has led to an additional dispute; namely, what exactly was the value at issuance?

Does this really make any difference to you as an owner of these shares? Not really until you decide to sell your shares, in which case you could be liable for the tax on a capital gain from the time of issuance until the time of sale. How much gain? Well, that depends on your cost basis; and there's the problem.

There is a creative way out of this problem. If you make a charitable gift of your shares to an institution such as The Lakewood Masonic Foundation, you are entitled to deduct the market value of your shares as of the date of your gift. No sale, no capital gain, no capital gains tax—just a charitable deduction. Of course, you are always encouraged to seek legal and tax counsel before entering into any such transaction.

If we are to save our historic home for future generations of Masons and Eastern Stars, your gifts to The Lakewood Masonic Foundation will be absolutely essential to fund vitally needed preservation projects. Gifts to the Foundation—whether life insurance stock, other securities, property or cash—are deductible for federal tax purposes to the extent permitted by law.

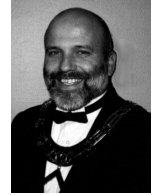

Temperance

One of the four cardinal virtues, the practise of which is inculcated in the First Degree. The Freemason who properly appreciates the secrets which he has solemnly promised never to reveal, will not, by yielding to the unrestrained call of appetite, permit reason and judgment to lose their seats, and subject himself, by the indulgence in habits of excess, to discover that which should be concealed, and thus merit and receive the scorn and detestation of his Brethren. And lest any Brother should forget the danger to which he is exposed in the unguarded hours of dissipation, the virtue of *temperance* is wisely impressed upon his memory, by its reference to once of the most solemn portions of the ceremony of initiation. Some Freemasons, very properly condemning the vice of intemperance and abhorring its effects, have been unwisely led to confound temperance with total abstinence in a Masonic application, and resolutions have sometimes been proposed in Grand Lodges which declare the use of stimulating liquors in any quantity a Masonic offense. But the law of Freemasonry authorizes no such regulation. It leaves to every man the indulgence of his own tastes within due limits, and demands not abstinence, but only moderation and temperance, in anything not actually wrong.

Grammar

One of the seven liberal arts and sciences, which forms, with Logic and Rhetoric, a triad dedicated to the cultivation of language. "God," says Sanctius, "created man the participant of reason; and as he willed him to be a social being, he bestowed upon him the gift of language, in the perfecting of which there are three aids. The first is *Grammar*, which rejects from language all solecisms and barbarous expressions; the second is *Logic*, which is occupied with the truthfulness of language; and the third is *Rhetoric*, which seeks only the adornment of the language."

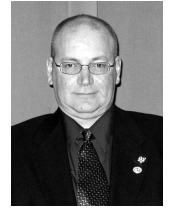

I wish to thank the fraters of Holy Grail Commandery for your vote of confidence in electing me to serve as your Commander this year. I will do all in my power to merit the confidence you have reposed. We have a dedicated corps of officers; and I have every confidence that they, too, will do their very best in serving our Commandery.

My father was Commander of Holy Grail 1956-57, and it is certainly a pleasure to have the opportunity to continue this "tradition." When I was a child, my "family" included several fraters who served as Commander. These fine men were my first introduction to Masonry. Among them were Earl Armesy, Elred Holiday, Ray Pagel, Neil McBane, Walter Pickin, Abe Kloots, Lex Kintner, George Tabata and most especially very close friends of our family Harry Roller, Charlie Lohiser, Fred Falck, Harry Barger and Bill Elliot. Among these fraters were Masons in the truest sense of the word, for they manifestly began their Masonic careers by having first been prepared in their hearts. They shared a deep faith in Almighty God; and not only did they listen to Masonic ritual, but they understood it and LIVED it. So may we all, at all times and with all mankind, but most especially with our Brethren.

Brotherhood of the Olive Branch in the East

An Order, which was proposed at Bombay, in 1845, by Dr. James Burnes, the author of a History of the Knights Templar, who was then the Provincial Grand Master of India for Scotland. It was intended to provide a substitute for native Freemasons for the Chivalric Degrees, from which, on account of their religious faith, they were excluded. It consisted of three classes, Novice, Companion, and Officer. For the first, it was requisite that the candidate should have been initiated into Freemasonry; for the second, that he should be a Master Mason; and for the third it was recommended, but not imperatively required, that he should have attained the Royal Arch Degree. The badge of the Order was a dove descending with a green olive-branch in its mouth. The new Order was received with much enthusiasm by the most distinguished Freemasons of India, but it did not secure a permanent existence.
